Fr. Mark E. Wedig, O.P., Chair of the Department of Theology and Philosophy, Barry University in Miami Shores, Florida is serving as the visiting Dominican Scholar at The Aquinas Center of Theology, Center for Catholic Studies at Emory University during the Academic Year 2001-2002.

Fr. Wedig holds a Ph.D. in liturgical studies from The Catholic University of America. He also holds a Master of Divinity degree from the Dominican School of Philosophy and Theology, Berkeley, California. He has received awards or fellowships for study at The Catholic University of America and at the Yale Divinity School.

Fr. Wedig's scholarly work includes many publications about aesthetics and liturgy. Among his most recent publications are two articles: one on theology, "The Fraternal Context of Congar's Achievement: The platform for a Renewed Catholicism at Les Editions du Cerf (1927-1954) in the US Catholic Historian (Spring 1999); and another on aesthetics, "The Defeat of Visual Aesthetic Arianism" in Source and Summit; Commemorating Josef A. Jungmann, SJ edited by Pierce and Downey, Collegeville: The Liturgical Press, 1999.

On February 9, 2002 Dr. Don Saliers and Fr. Wedig will co-conduct a follow up workshop, "Image and Song in the Great Fifty Days" built around the theology and spirituality found in Lent.
